





The children answered that sunlight would come in through that. The teachers then informed the children that the same was happening to the Earth's huge umbrella as it was getting holes in it and hence the harmful rays of the Sun are coming in through it.















INTERNATIONAL ALZHEIMER'S DAY







Alzheimer's disease is a progressive neurologic disorder that causes the brain to shrink (atrophy) and brain cells to die.


Here's what we did: Students were encouraged to colour a picture of the brain using their creativity, followed with a parental engagement questionnaire. – My Amazing Brain.























TONGUE TWISTER COMPETITION


WORLD CAR FREE DAY

related to it.


















CORE ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT







